

Verb To Be: Affirmative Form

Because one of the most important verbs in English is the "to be" verb. It is used in more than forty percent of sentences. Do you want to know more about that? Then, Let's begin

So, the verb **"To Be"** is used with adjectives, jobs, nationalities, places, age, etc.

Today, we are going to see the affirmative form of the verb **"TO BE"**.

The verb **"TO BE"** in English has three forms: **AM**, **IS** and **ARE**.

AM — is used for the pronoun **I**

IS — for **HE/SHE/IT**

ARE — goes to **YOU/WE/THEY**

Here, we have some examples with the personal pronouns:

- I **am** a teacher.
- You **are** a student.
- He **is** very intelligent.
- She **is** 20 years old.
- It **is** a book.
- We **are** friends.
- You **are** engineers.
- They **are** Peruvian.



Now, let's see some examples with nouns:

- Tom **is** a doctor.
- Lisa **is** very beautiful.
- Bob and Sandra **are** good students.
- My brother and I **are** tall.
- My cat **is** brown.
